COURAGE - Connecting Collections
 Cultural Opposition – Understanding the Cultural Heritage of Dissent in the Former Socialist Countries

The COURAGE project will recognize the importance of dissent in former socialist countries by surveying and connecting collections on cultural opposition.

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What is COURAGE?

Culture in Eastern Europe before 1989 meant more than socialist realism and out-propaganda art. An alternative cultural scene flourished despite the controls of socialist regimes, embracing diverse practices such as:

- non-conformist avant-garde art,
- cinema, performance art, music, dance, and fine arts,
- unofficial education and publication (samizdat),
- youth subcultures, underground punk, and rock bands,
- human rights and environmental (green) movements,
- nationalist/popular cultural movements,
- exiled and emigrant groups,
- alternative ways of life, and even
- novel religious practices.

COURAGE is the first international research project that tackles this rich and colourful legacy of cultural opposition in the former socialist countries of Eastern Europe by exploring and comparing collections on cultural opposition. In so doing, the project will help us recognize and acknowledge forms of dissent and preserve these manifestations of resistance as part of our common European heritage.

- Courage wants to understand the role of collections in shaping the concepts of cultural opposition. Therefore,
- Courage collects data on collections of cultural opposition.

COURAGE will create

- a comprehensive international online database (electronic registry) of existing but
- scattered public and private collections on the histories and forms of cultural opposition in the former socialist countries and thereby
- make the collections more accessible.

COURAGE will further a more nuanced understanding of:

- how these collections work,
- what functions they serve in their respective societies, and
- how they represent their holdings and findings to the national and international public.

The general aim of this analysis is to allow for the expanded outreach and increased impact of the collections by assessing the historical origins and legacies of various forms of cultural opposition.

Activities

COURAGE will develop an innovative range of activities. In addition to creating the online database of collections, the project will generate:

- a web portal in English and in the national languages of the respective countries,
- online teaching material for education,
- online and travelling exhibitions,
- country reports and policy recommendations,
- film festivals,
- a handbook,
- training days for the stakeholders of the collections to enhance their cooperative capacity.

Target Groups

- Professional staff and the stakeholders of the collections. COURAGE will strengthen their standing by making the collections readily accessible to the wider international public;
- Academics, researchers and teachers. For them, the online database will serve both as an instructional tool and as a gateway for further research;
- Policy makers at the local and national levels, and the European Commission and other European institutions. COURAGE will produce a set of policy recommendations concerning the use of collections for research and education;
- Members of the younger generation (school classes, students, young professionals), with engaging audio-visual tools, interactive activities, and contemporary social media. COURAGE will transform the values and legacy of cultural opposition into a personal experience for them.
